WRESTLERS HALT IMMERSION...

However, after spending an hour and 45 minutes, they returned after several khap and political leaders urged them not to take such an extreme step. As the deadline for the immersion of the medals drew closer, senior farmer leaders Sham Singh Malik and Narush Tikait sought five days time from the grappleers to resolve the issue.

"The khap leaders put their turbans before us and said 'do not lose hope. Keep the dignity of the turban and return. So we decided to wait,' said wrestler Jitender Kinha, who has been a part of the protesting group. There were chaotic scenes at the Har ki Pauri as khap and farmer leaders broke the human chain of supporters to reach out to the grappleers, even as thousands of devotees, who had gathered on the occasion of Ganga Dussehra, looked baffled as commoner reigned supreme. The wrestlers left without speaking with the media. Several other khap leaders and Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann also came out in support of the wrestlers but urged them to show restraint. "The wrestlers have said they will immerse their medals in Ganga river. We request them that these medals are the result of their hardwork, sacrifices of their families and support from society, they should not take this step."

"It is unfortunate that those who represented the nation in top international tournaments that they are forced to take such decisions. The government should have some shame and give justice to them," Khap leader Balwant Nambardar said.

'Allegations serious...'

Sisodia was arrested by the CBI on February 26. The high court said the allegations against him were serious in nature. Citing the allegations against the AAP leader, it said, the excise policy was formed at the instance of the "South Group" with mala fide intention to give undue advantage to them. "Such an act points towards the misconduct of the applicant, who was admittedly a public servant and holding highest position. The statement of the concerned excise officers has been relied upon by the CBI," it said.

Will return awards...

"We have submitted a copy of the memorandum to Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu. He has assured us of arranging a meeting with Shah in the evening after his return from Churachandpur. We will handover the memorandum to him then," Channu said. The memorandum is also signed by other Arjun awardees from the state. They are Oram Bemben Devi (also Padma Shri), N. Soniya Channu, M. Bhoji Singh, Y. Sanathoi Devi, L. Shushila Devi and M. Suranjoy Singh.

In the memorandum, the sports persons questioned the central security forces in controlling the violence despite "Kuki terrorists challenging the integrity of Manipur" by killing people and burning houses. "We condemn such attacks on unarmed civilians, specially in the peripheral areas of the valley districts," they added. The sports persons demanded revocation of the Suspension of Operation (SOO) agreement with Kuki militant groups, restoration of peace and normalcy at the earliest and protection of unity and integrity of Manipur. "The demand to disintegrate the state is not acceptable under any circumstances," the memorandum said and demanded deportation of all illegal immigrants. The sports personalities also urged the government to lift the blockade on NH 2 as it has led to skyrocketing of prices of essential commodities.

The highway runs from Dibrugarh in Assam to Tuipang in Mizoram. It passes through Assam, Nagaland, Manipur and Mizoram. "Meiteis are allowed to settle only in the valley which constitutes just about 10 per cent of the total geographical area of Manipur. Where will they settle after some years if the present system is allowed to continue? So, allow Meiteis to settle in the hills of Manipur," the memorandum added.

In the presentation, information about the installation of statues was given. Singh further said agreement for construction of Mahakal Lok was inked between Congress government and the M/s M/P Babaria, DII Patel and Gaysari Electricals. Singh said there was no corruption in the corridor construction. The way the Congress is making allegations against the government indicates that they were involved in corruption, Singh said, adding that if necessary, there will be an inquiry into the matter. The cost of more than 100 idols was Rs 7.75 crore and that the contractor concerned will replace the damaged idols with the new ones, he said.

"The Congress is doing dirty politics over the issue, but they should provide evidence of corruption, Singh said.

Around 150 medical colleges across country may lose recognition

Around 150 medical colleges of the country are likely to lose recognition of the National Medical Commission - the regulatory body for country's medical education and medical professionals - for inadequate faculty and non-compliance of rules. Already, 40 medical colleges have lost recognition and must show to the NMC that they are following set standards. The list of colleges which the NMC's radar includes medical colleges in Gujarat, Assam, Puducherry, Tamil

Nadu, Punjab, Andhra Pradesh, Tripura and West Bengal. The deficiencies were revealed during an inspection carried out by the Undergraduate Medical Education Board of the Commission for over a month, in which they looked into CCTV cameras, lapses in Adhar linked biometric attendance procedures and

the faculty rolls. Sources said the colleges were not following the criteria to run a medical college, including proper campus installation and their functioning. Biometric working was not working properly. Many posts in the faculties were also found vacant during the inspection. The medical colleges have the option to appeal, sources said. The first appeal can be made at the NMC within 30 days. If the appeal is rejected, they can approach the Union Ministry of Health.

MANIPUR VIOLENCE

HM announces Rs 10 lakh for victims' families

IMPHAL: Union Home Minister Amit Shah, who had already held a half a dozen meetings since his arrival in violence-hit Manipur on Monday night, on Tuesday visited Churachandpur, one of the districts severely affected by the ethnic violence that ravaged the state since May 8, leaving at least 75 dead and over 300 injured. According to a senior Manipur government official, during a meeting between the Home Minister and state council of ministers headed by the Chief Minister, it was decided to give compensation of Rs 10 lakh each to those who died during the ethnic violence. A government job would also be provided to a kin of the family whose members were killed in the violence. The compensation amount would be equally borne by the Centre and the state. Officials said that in the tribal-dominated Churachandpur, Shah held meetings with various Civil Society Organisations (CSOs), influential tribal leaders and local security and civil administrations officials. "This crucial engagement aims to study the

actual situation in ground zero and gather inputs and better understand the challenges faced by the affected communities," a government official said in Imphal.

He said that the Home Minister is likely to chair an all party meeting in Imphal on Tuesday or Wednesday as part of the efforts to bring peace and normalcy in the northeastern state, where a large number of government and non-government projects and nearly 1,800 houses destroyed in the ethnic hostilities.
